



# Transitions - Serving Single Mothers with Children

- Served 24 Families 24 Adults, 51 Children
- 67% of participants obtained housing at program exit
- 78% of participants obtained/maintained employment at program exit
- 78% of participants increased income at program exit
- 42 Life Skills classes were offered; 67% of participants graduated from *Jobs for Life* program and 67% graduated from *Faith and Finance* program

#### **Next Steps - Program Aftercare**

- Served 5 families 10 adults, 33 children
- 70% of participants maintained housing
- 80% of participants maintained or increased income
- 83% of former participants maintained housing for one year after exiting the program


- Served 7 households 8 adults, 4 children

#### **Youth Program**


- Served 51 youth

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# **Transitions - Serving Single Mothers with Children**

- Served 25 Families 25 Adults, 48 Children
- 69% of participants obtained housing at program exit
- 46% of participants obtained/maintained employment at program exit
- 62% of participants increased income at program exit
- 35 Life Skills classes were offered; 92% of participants completed a budgeting program
- 62% of participants were connected to entitlement benefits they were not previously receiving
- 100% of participants connected to community resources

#### **Next Steps - Program Aftercare**

- Served 4 families 4 adults, 10 children
- 75% of participants maintained housing
- 100% of participants maintained or increased income
- 75% of former participants maintained housing for one year after exiting program

# **Side by Side - Serving Families with Disabilities**

- Served 7 households 13 adults, 3 children
- 100% of participants maintained housing
- 100% of participants maintained or increased income
- 100% of participants accomplished at least one goal within a year of being in the program

#### **Youth Program**

- Served 48 youth
- 92% demonstrated competency in skill building activities
- 75% demonstrated competency in conflict resolution activities
- 82% demonstrated competency in selfregulation activities

## Value of Adopt-an-Apartment Program

The Adopt-an-Apartment program launched in May 2017. In its first year, five volunteer groups adopted 7 apartments. Groups assisted with cleaning and furnishing the apartments to create a safe and welcoming space for new families entering the Transitions program. The Adopt-an-Apartment program has not only touched the lives of the women and children in Transitions but has also maximized BHA's resources. As we have increased the number of families we can serve over the last 5 years, the property workload has also increased. This volunteer program has engaged new volunteers in a meaningful way and allowed our property manager to focus on other projects.

#### **Furnishing the Apartment:**

- Three 1-bedroom units were adopted at a value of \$1,640 each plus labor
- Four 2-bedroom units were adopted at a value of \$2,030 each plus labor

### **Apartment Item Values:**

Twin mattress and frame-\$250

Full mattress and frame-\$350

Dresser-\$100

Dining room table-\$200

Sofa- \$500

TV and stand-\$250

Linens/towels-\$40

Dishes/pots and pans-\$50

Misc- \$100

Pack n play-\$50

#### Labor:

75 volunteer hours x \$25 an hour (Property Manager salary as this is saving his time)= \$1,875

Total value of Adopt an apartment for FY17-18= \$1,875 (labor amount) + \$13,040 (total value of items donated for the apartments) = \$14,915
